

Major milestones

The Asbury Our Redeemer Partnership has had a banner month. In mid February the FISH Food Bank building campaign achieved its fundraising goal and is now ready to start the contracting process to build! On February 13 the Collins Foundation announced a grant award of \$75,000. With the previous award from the Meyer Memorial Trust of \$125,000 and a private donation of \$50,000 we have received over \$1,000,000 to build. If the contract bids come in as projected, construction can start this spring.

The only unfinished fund raising is for the addition of solar panels which the children of the congregation have started. To date \$5,000 has been raised for this effort and a grant for \$11,000 has been awarded. We anticipate the total cost for solar panels to be approximately \$30,000, so we are over half way there.

The second major milestone is the announcement of our new pastor, Rev. David D.M. King. Rev. King is currently a full time doctoral student at Iliff School of Theology in Denver, Colorado. He and his wife Melissa have a seven year old son, Karthik. Bishop Grant Hagiya of the Oregon-Idaho Annual Conference will appoint Rev. David King as our pastor effective July 1, 2014. David previously served as pastor at First UMC in Coos Bay, OR and currently serves as a part time pastor in Hudson, Colorado. David met with the Board and Staff Parish Relations committee on Monday 17 February. We were all impressed with his intelligence, energy and enthusiasm to serve our partnership. We are all looking forward to welcoming David and his family to Hood River and our partnership.
