Dear Friends,

I have felt such an increased sense of grounding in our church since the adoption of our constitution. It is a great accomplishment, bringing two congregations together. It's been a lot of work, too, and you all deserve to be proud of it.



We're coming up to the next phase of the process. As we're finishing up with our Season of Listening, we'll be moving into the process of discovering a new name for this church. My top priority for the name is that it be something that is clear to folks outside our congregation, something that leads us forward in mission.

As with all change, the prospect of a new name can produce anxiety. Asbury United Methodist Church and Our Redeemer Lutheran Church have proud histories of mission and ministry in this area. And their histories will continue to be our history. As we take this new step together, we will also be finding ways to remember and honor our past.

We have the great fortune to have a resource person who is an expert in church naming and in the processes of discovering them together. **Jan Wierima from the Oregon Synod office (ELCA)** will be our guide through the journey of naming. During one of the Sundays in April, she will have a brief exercise for us during worship to help us get primed for the conversation. Then on **Saturday May 7th, 9-11:30am**, she will lead us through what should be a fun process of exploring all of the possibilities of what a name might be and mean. That gathering, to which you are all heartily invited, should generate three possible names for us to consider more deeply. After continued conversation, we will hold a congregational meeting, tentatively scheduled for Sunday, June 5th, to choose our name from among those three.

Like many, I'm a little nervous, but I am mostly excited. We have come so far together, and I really look forward to having a clear way to tell the community who we are and what we are about. We have something really special here, something to be proud of. We are a congregation that is able to reach across denominational boundaries, across state boundaries, across secular-sacred boundaries to share a ministry of transformation with this community, a ministry in which Christ is leading us. I pray this new name will help us to better share that message of transformation in Christ with the world around us.

Safe Sanctuaries is our way of protecting our children, youth, vulnerable adults, and our volunteers who work with them. Pastor David did a great job of organizing this brief training class (20 minutes, really!) If you missed the training, we hope to make a video version available soon.

The Story

The Story is an abridged, chronological version of the Bible that reads like a novel. Our kids in grades 2-6 are using this book for their class on Sunday morning. This is the second group of our young people to read through *The Story*. It does a good job of building on the Bible stories encountered in the previous Children's Worship and Wonder class. We have committed teachers for the class, but volunteers are always needed to serve as our second adult for the class (a Safe Sanctuaries strategy). This is a very easy way to spend time with our kids and to see what they are learning. A sign up sheet is located on the bulletin board in the hallway.

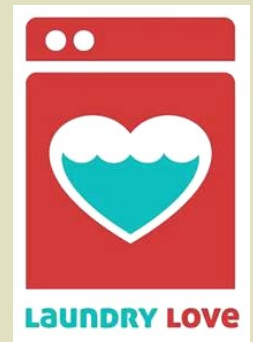
Clients were engaging and so thankful to have the opportunity to wash their backpack full of soiled clothing and personal belongings.
