First Reading: Hebrews 10:11-14, 19-25

Every other priest performs services every day and offer the same sacrifices many times; but these sacrifices can never take away sins. Christ, however, offered one sacrifice for sins, an offering that is effective forever. Then Christ sat down at the right hand of God, and now waits there until God puts all enemies in their rightful place. With one sacrifice then, Jesus has made perfect forever those who are being sanctified.

Therefore, sisters and brothers, since the blood of Jesus makes us confident to enter the holy place by the new living path opened for us through the veil - that is to say, the body of Jesus - and since we have the supreme high priest presiding over the house of God, let us enter it filled with faith and with sincerity in our hearts, our hearts sprinkled and cleared from any trace of bad conscience and our bodies washed pure with water. Let us keep firm in the hope we profess, because the One who made the promise is faithful.

Let us always think of how we can stimulate each other to love and good works. Don't stay away from the meetings of the community, as some do, but encourage one another; and do this all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

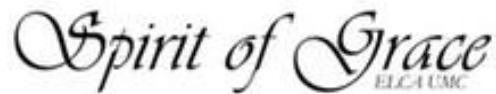
Announcements

- **New Member Sunday - November 21st**
 - On the final Sunday in our liturgical year, which this year falls on the third Sunday in November, we will welcome our new members into our community! Be sure to join us for worship on November 21st for this celebratory occasion.

- **Safe Sanctuary Training - 11:15 am, November 21st**
 - In accordance with our Safe Sanctuary Policy (which can be reviewed here), we will be holding a Safe Sanctuary Training following worship on November 21st. We will watch a 30 minute presentation from Patrick Lemmon (who facilitated a Safe Sanctuaries Training for the UMC Oregon-Idaho Conference over the summer), followed by a brief review of our own policy.
 - Usually these trainings are required for anyone who works with youth or vulnerable populations in our church. While our current formal youth programming is on pause, this does not mean we aren't regularly engaging with youth and vulnerable individuals. **Therefore, we strongly encourage anyone who volunteers with Spirit of Grace in any capacity (serving on the board, helping out in worship, volunteering at FISH, etc.) to attend this training in order to be better equipped to serve our community.**

- **UMC Fall Charge Conference - 5:30 pm on November 28th**
 - On November 28th, Rev. Tim Overton-Harris, District Superintendent of the UMC Oregon-Idaho Conference, will be visiting Spirit of Grace in person for our annual Fall Charge Conference. This is an opportunity for Rev. Tim to check in with us and hear about the life and ministry of our congregation. While attendance is not required, any member of Spirit of Grace is welcome and encouraged to attend in order to share their experiences from the past two years with Rev. Tim. Anyone who volunteers or serves in a leadership capacity at Spirit of Grace is highly encouraged to attend as well, in order to share a more full picture of our life and ministry here in Hood River.
