Beloved Siblings in Christ,

Summer is finally here! Though it felt like the rainy cold days would linger endlessly, the sun has finally broken through, and it looks like blue skies and hot afternoons are here to stay. As the earth of the Columbia Gorge comes alive, bearing abundant food and flowers to nourish our bodies and souls, I find myself contemplating the new ways in which God is calling all of us to grow and blossom in abundance in our own unique ways.

When I was first discerning my call to Spirit of Grace and learning more about this unique congregation, one of the goals articulated by the call committee was, "We want to build on the work that has been done by the Transition Team to continue to clarify the identity of Spirit of Grace." The Ministry Site Profile compiled by the Transition Team did a wonderful job describing the history, passion, gifts, and challenges of this congregation – I remember being filled with joy and excitement upon first reading about this small congregation! Over the past year, as I have learned even more about the people and community who make up Spirit of Grace, I've only fallen deeper in love with the story and mission of this congregation. UMC Greater Northwest Annual Conference Summary

The UMC's Greater Northwest Annual Conference was held virtually once again this year, from June 19-25, as we gathered online to conduct important business of the church. On Sunday evening we convened for opening worship and listened to Bishop Elaine's final Episcopal Address as her term draws to an end (<u>listen to or read the transcript of this address here</u>). The evening concluded with some laity and ministry tema reports, as well as approving the upcoming budget. On Thursday, members of the Oregon-Idaho conference met for our plenary as we celebrated new elders, recognized the service of those retiring, and lifted up prospective Episcopal names for discernment. In the afternoon, we continued discussing and voting upon many action items and standing resolutions, which can be read in <u>this packet of materials</u>. On Saturday, we gathered to take care of some business across the three conferences, and had a special closing worship and celebration for Bishop Stanovsky, ahead of her retirement at the end of the year.

The GNW conference also acted quickly in response to the Supreme Court's most recent decision regarding abortion, and voted to publically release this statement, as well as set up a fund to allow GNW Area members to support conference and area staff, clergy and their family members who may be impacted by this restriction of reproductive freedom. Spirit of Grace Board of Directors - June Meeting Minutes (abbreviated)

Present: Pastor Miranda, Shelley Oates, Tom Hart, Cindy Murahashi, and Sharon Poynter via Zoom. Gordon Leigh and Michelle Sibley were unable to attend.

Currently there is about \$25,167.55 in the bank, this includes 5K Grant and 3K for Happy Hands. Key bank has a \$10,000 CD up for renewal. Regular giving is about \$49,000 to date.

Pastor Miranda gave her report. Lent zoom services went well. Maundy Thursday service was well attended and was very worshipful. Easter was also well attended and it was nice to be able to share in fellowship and refreshments. Pastor attended the ELCA Oregon Synod Conference in Sun River. Jim and Cherri Anderson were our congregational delegates.

The congregation received the \$5,000 Technology Grant from UMC. The money has been allocated for upgraded A/V and improved live streaming services to implement by summer's end. This will require training and adding at least a couple more people to run the PA and powerpoint, and formulating a Technology ministry to include live streaming services. Cindy wondered about hiring someone with knowledge of live streaming and asking UMC if they can suggest someone as a consultant or trainer. It was the consensus of the Board to pursue this.

There are new individuals attending services. This is very encouraging. We will continue to maintain our mask policy for indoor worship. Hopefully we will start up fellowship with refreshments after services within the guidelines of local Covid status.

Short Term Mission Goals:

Pastor Miranda is organizing Ministry Teams with at least 3-4 members each, to promote the idea of intentional and fluid accessibility for all to engage in the ministry of the church.

There is also a need for better communication and transparency of the Board and other groups of the congregation. We will utilize the Bulletin Board as another means of communication. The church website is sorely outdated and in need of updating and reworking.

We need to establish and redefine our mission statement and goals that accurately represent Spirit of Grace. To accomplish this we can share a workshop session with the congregation encouraging spontaneous ideas.

Another concern is adding By-Laws to our Constitution. Shelley will look into this and contact other congregations to see how they amended &/or added to their documents.

Pastor Miranda closed the meeting by reading "Psalm of Possibility" by Gail Song Batum.

Responding to the Supreme Court Ruling on Abortion

In light of the Supreme Court's most recent ruling on abortion on June 24th, I'm sure that many of you are wondering what our church and our faith has to say on this manner, and how we as Christians are called to respond. In worship on June 26th, I shared excerpts from several statements released by our denominations, all of which expressed a similar sentiment: Regardless of our personal opinions on the morality of this issue and whether life begins at conception or birth, this decision by the Supreme Court denies the bodily autonomy, dignity, and sacred worth of the lives of all people who need to make decisions about unplanned pregnancies.
