Beloved Siblings in Christ,



On August 21st, I will celebrate my one-year anniversary as an ordained minister of Word and Sacrament. I can hardly believe that it has already been a year since Jenni and I packed up our belongings, loaded up the car with pets and essentials, and drove from Minnesota to Oregon to start our lives here in Hood River. As I look back on my first year of professional ministry, it has been one filled with joy and struggles, grief and laughter, exciting possibilities and uncertain futures – and I've been learning and growing every step of the way. I am filled with immense gratitude for all that this community has taught me so far, and for all of the love and support you have shown to my family – and I'm even more grateful that this is still just the beginning of our ministry together!

This past year has been filled with its own unique set of challenges, as we learned that resuming life together in a continuing pandemic is by no means a linear process. And yet you all have been flexible and resilient amidst switches from in-person to online worship, adapting to precautions that allow us to gather together safely, because of your profound desire to be in relationship and community with one another. Even in adverse conditions, there is still a palpable joy on Sundays after worship as you connect with one another, sharing stories, asking for prayer, offering wisdom and advice, and pondering where/how God is calling us to dwell in our community. Regardless of the state of our world, there is so much healing and hope to be found in relationship with one another. As Paul writes in his letter to the people of Corinth,

"It was by one Spirit that all of us were baptized into one body. All of us have been given to drink of the one Spirit. And that body is not one part; it is many."

All of us are bound together by the Spirit, called to live a life enriched by the presence of one another so that we can more fully embody God's missional calling for us in this world: to share the gospel, live as Jesus taught us, and cultivate the Beloved Community of the Kingdom of God here on earth for all people.

The isolation of the pandemic has taken its toll on all of us in one way or another, because God created us to be in community and relationship with one another, first and foremost. Whether in Bible study or book discussions, through coffee hour or gardening, in the church building or out in our community, the Spirit of God comes alive and moves through us when we engage in this relational work. Season of Creation at Spirit of Grace

For 5 Sundays, from September 1st to October 4th, Spirit of Grace will be joining with churches from around the world to participate in the Season of Creation - a liturgical season designed to support Christian churches in strengthening our engagement and forming a united, faithful response to the growing environmental crisis. The Season of Creation ecumenical steering committee comes together each year to provide resources to empower Christians to enter a shared season of reflection and action, each in the tradition of their own denomination.



The theme for 2022 is Listen to the Voice of Creation, to encourage us to listen to the "voices of those who

suffer the impacts of climate change. These are voices of mose who who hold generational wisdom about how to live gratefully within the limits of the land. These are voices of a diminishing diversity of more-than-human species. It is the voice of the Earth." The symbol for 2022 is the burning bush, signifying not only the prevalence of unnatural forest fires, but also burning bush that appeared to Moses, affirming "that God heard the cries of all who suffered, and promised to be with us as we followed faithfully to deliverance from injustice."

For each of the 5 Sundays in the Season of Creation, our liturgy, hymns, and sermon will all be centered around this theme. Stay tuned for updates on other events, discussions, and ways to participate in this liturgical season!



Worship Livestream Update

Thanks to the generous grant we received from the Columbia District Extension Society of the UMC, we have a new and improved livestream setup for worship! We now have three cameras that we will be using to capture different angles of the sanctuary during worship, and will be connected directly to the soundboard to improve the audio quality. We will still be streaming via Facebook Live, for those who like to take advantage of interacting with the livestream via comments and reactions – but beginning August 7th, the livestream can be viewed directly on the homepage of our website, with no need to go to an external site!

As this is a new technology set up, there will likely be glitches that need to be worked out in the first few weeks, so we ask for your patience as we troubleshoot any problems that arise. Lifelong Learning: Study Groups

In previous years, our Thursday Evening Study Group has been an excellent opportunity for a small group to gather regularly to engage in study and reflection in community with one another. This group has gathered weekly throughout the year, typically meeting from September - Advent, January - Lent, and Easter - June, discussing 2-3 books over the course of these 3 sessions. The group begins by reading a chapter or section together, and members take turns leading the discussion, using pre-written discussion questions. This year, we'd like to expand on this by creating multiple small groups that will all study the same text! Below, you'll find the proposed schedule for 2022-2023, and the two books we'll be reading:

Fall Session (September - November, 10-11 weeks)

The Wild Land Within: Cultivating Wholeness Through Spiritual Practice by Lisa Colón DeLay

The wilderness of the heart may be untamed, but you don't need to go there alone. In The Wild Land Within, spiritual companion and podcast host Lisa Colón DeLay offers a map to our often-bewildering inner terrain, inviting us to deepen and expand our encounters with God. Through specific spiritual practices from early desert monastics, as well as Latinx, Black, and Indigenous contemplatives, she guides us in cultivating lives of devotion. In opening ourselves up to God's healing, we will inevitably come across wounds we didn't even know we had. Colón DeLay uses theology and neuroscience to help us work through buried fear or pain and find embodied spiritual healing from trauma. A contemplative map to the wilderness of the heart, The Wild Land Within guides us through intimate geography in which God dwells.

Winter Session (January - February, 6-7 weeks)

Wholehearted Faith by Rachel Held Evans & Jeff Chu


Rachel Held Evans is widely recognized for her theologically astute, profoundly honest, and beautifully personal books, which have guided, instructed, edified, and shaped Christians as they seek to live out a just and loving faith.

At the time of her tragic death in 2019, Rachel was working on a new book about wholeheartedness. With the help of her close friend and author Jeff Chu, that work-in-progress has been woven together with some of her other unpublished writings into a rich collection of essays that ask candid questions about the stories we've been told--and the stories we tell--about our faith, our selves, and our world. This book is for the doubter and the dreamer, the seeker and the sojourner, those who long for a sense of spiritual wholeness as well as those who have been hurt by the Church but can't seem to let go of the story of Jesus. Through theological reflection and personal recollection, Rachel wrestles with God's grace and love, looks unsparingly at what the Church is and does, and explores universal human questions about becoming and belonging. An unforgettable, moving, and intimate book.

Spring Session (April - June, 8-9 weeks) Wholehearted Faith (continued)

To participate in our Fall Session, sign up on the sheet in the narthex or email Pastor Miranda to indicate your interest. Participants will receive an email asking them to list their availability and preferences for meeting (in -person or via zoom). Once all have had the opportunity to sign up, they will be divided into small groups based on their schedule and meeting preference, in order to be accommodating to as many needs and schedules as possible.

Safe Sanctuaries Event: The Cells Remember

Safe Sanctuaries is more than a policy, it is a way of life. Safe Sanctuaries acknowledges that all members of our congregations have experienced trauma in one form or another over the past several years. Children come to VBS knowing how to hide from active shooters. Youth face ridicule and peer pressure from online and inperson bullies. As adults, we bring the news into our lives through media outlets. Our nightly news brings the chaos and concerns of our world into our living rooms. Where do we go when this is too much? How can we

as a caring congregation support each other?

John Wesley calls us to "First, do no harm, do all the good you can, stay in love with God" and our baptismal vows remind us of our need to care for all people. This is why the Safe Sanctuaries team has created an event around trauma. In our 90 minute gathering we will discuss what trauma is, how it affects our lives, and how as a spiritual community we can learn self-care.



Oregon Synod Lay Education Course

How might I prepare for my own death? What are ways to be present, grounded, and supportive as someone dies or grieves?

Join with others from around the Oregon Synod as we learn more about the dying process itself, what happens shortly after death, and advance planning. We'll also explore the legacies we want to leave, knowing our own grief, being present for others' grief, and related rituals. This on-line course will meet on eight Tuesday evenings from 6:30-8 pm (Pacific Time) beginning September 20. We'll be joined by several guest instructors with a depth of experience in chaplaincy, palliative care, and hospice.

The course is designed with a Lutheran lens and



inclusive heart; all are welcome. Course participants and/or their congregations are encouraged to donate, as they are able, on a sliding scale between \$20-\$160, but donations are not required to participate.

Lift Every Voice Oregon - IP 17 Update

In response to the resolution passed at the 2022 Oregon Synod Assembly, Spirit of Grace collected signatures every Sunday in June for the petition to put IP 17 on the November ballot. On Friday, July 8, members of Lift Every Voice Oregon (LEVO) gathered at Augustana Lutheran Church in Portland to kick off a journey to deliver IP 17 signatures to the Secretary of State's office.



Faith leaders, students and community members boarded a school bus and journeyed to Salem, where they held a rally and marched arm-in-arm to deliver boxes of over 130,000 petition signatures.

Surpassing the required number of signatures, the measure will be on the Oregon November ballot. If passed by voters, would ban the sale of magazines with a capacity greater than 10 rounds and would require permits and firearm safety courses to purchase any gun. Applicants would have to pay a fee, submit to fingerprinting and pass a criminal background check.

5th Sunday Special Offering in July: Warm Springs Community Action Team

Over the last year, Spirit of Grace's Reckoning with Racism Team has spent time learning the history of the land we now worship on, prior to the displacement of the many indigenous communities who lived here for centuries. In honor and recognition of this, our 5th Sunday Offering will be going to a group that works to strengthen and empower members of the Warm Spring Reservation, to help them create a better future for their community.

The <u>Warm Springs Community Action Team</u> is a non-profit community development organization located on the Warm Springs Indian Reservation. WSCAT envisions a Warm Springs Reservation in which tribal and community members control their own destinies, in which people are in a position to provide for their families, pursue their hopes and dreams, and achieve their full potential:

By 2040, the people of the Warm Springs, grounded in our multi-tribal heritage, will have found new ways to live happily and well, with healthy families residing in stable homes, locally-owned businesses supporting the community, our youth pursuing education, growth, and personal development, and our elders looking back on lives in which persistence and hard work helped create a stable, strong Warm Springs middle class and a vibrant economy. The people of Warm Springs will understand the importance of caring for our environment and our culture, draw strength and identity from time-honored knowledge systems, strive to reach personal and family goals, and demonstrate that good people with the right vision, values, and solutions to problems can achieve anything.
