Psalm 40:1-11

Unyielding, I called to you, YHWH,  
now at last you have stooped to me and answered my cry for help.  
**You have pulled me out of the Pit of Destruction,  
out of its mud and quicksand;  
you set my feet on a rock  
and made my steps firm.**  
You put a new song in my mouth,  
a song of praise for you.  
Many will look on in wonder  
and so will put their trust in you.  
**Happiness comes to those  
who put their trust in YHWH,  
instead of in human egos  
or people blind to the truth!**  
How many wonders you've worked for us,  
YHWH, my God!  
How many plans you've made for us;  
you have no equal!  
I want to recount them again and again.  
but their number is too great.  
**You don't desire sacrifice or oblation,  
instead you made my ears receptive to you;

**In the scroll of the book  
it is written about me."**  
**I desire to do your will, my God,  
and your law is written in my heart.**  
I'll proclaim your justice  
in the Great Assembly,  
and I won't keep my mouth shut,  
as you well know.  
**I have never kept your generosity to myself,  
but announced your faithfulness and saving action:  
I have made no secret of your love and faithfulness  
in the Great Assembly.**  
For your part, YHWH,  
don't withhold your love from me!  
Let your kindness and faithfulness  
constantly protect me

Gospel: John 1:29-42

The Holy Gospel according to John the 1st chapter.

The next day, catching sight of Jesus approaching, John exclaimed, "Look! There's God's sacrificial lamb, who takes away the world's sin! This is the one I was talking about when I said, 'The one who comes after me ranks ahead of me, for this One existed before I did.' I didn't recognize him, but it was so that he would be revealed to Israel as I came baptizing with water."

John also gave this testimony: "I saw the Spirit descend from heaven like a dove, and she came to rest on him. I didn't recognize him, but the One who sent me to baptize with water told me, 'When you see the Spirit descend and rest on someone, that is the One who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.' Now I have seen for myself and have testified that this is the Only Begotten of God."

The next day, John was by the Jordan again with two of his disciples. Seeing Jesus walk by, John said, "Look! There's the Lamb of God!" The two disciples heard what John said and followed Jesus.

When Jesus turned around and noticed them following, he asked them, "What are you looking for?"

They replied, "Rabbi," – which means "Teacher" – "where are you staying?"

"Come and see," Jesus answered.

So they went to see where he was staying, and they spent the rest of the day with him. It was about four in the afternoon.

One of the two who had followed Jesus after hearing John was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. The first thing Andrew did was find Simon Peter and say, "We've found the Messiah!" – which means, "the Anointed One."

Andrew brought Simon to Jesus, who looked hard at him and said, "You are Simon ben-Jonah; I will call you 'Rock'" – that is, Peter."

## Wesley's Covenant Service

### Introduction

Siblings in Christ,  
Through baptism, we have entered life with God  
and have been admitted into the new covenant  
of which Jesus Christ is the Mediator.  
Today, we meet, as the generations before us have met,  
to renew the covenant that binds us to God.  
Let us make this covenant of God our own.

### Invitation

Commit yourselves to Christ as his servants.  
Christ has many services to be done.  
Some are more easy and honorable,  
others are more difficult and disgraceful.  
Some are suitable to our inclinations and interests,  
others are contrary to both.  
In some we may please Christ and please ourselves.  
But then there are other works where we cannot please Christ  
except by denying our wants and desires..  
It is necessary, therefore,  
that we consider what it means to be a servant of Christ.

Let us, therefore, go to Christ, and pray:

**Let me be your servant, under your command.  
I will give up myself to your will in all things.**

Be satisfied that Christ shall give you your place and work.

**Lord, make me what you will.  
I put myself fully into your hands:  
put me to doing, put me to serving,  
let me be employed for you, or laid aside for you,  
let me be full, let me be empty,  
let me have all things, let me have nothing.  
I freely and with a willing heart  
give it all to your pleasure and disposal.**

To make this covenant a reality in your life, listen to these admonitions:

First, set apart some time,  
to be spent alone before the Lord;  
in seeking earnestly God's special assistance  
and gracious acceptance of you.

Consider the laws of Christ, how holy, strict, and spiritual they are,  
and whether you, after having carefully considered them,  
are willing to choose them all.

Second, be in a spirit of holy awe and reverence.

Third, claim God's covenant,  
rely upon God's promise of giving grace and strength,  
so you can keep your promise.

Fourth, resolve to be faithful.  
You have given to the Lord your hearts,  
you have opened your mouths to the Lord,  
and you have dedicated yourself to God

And last, be then prepared to renew your covenant with the Lord.  
Bow your head, lift your hands toward heaven,  
and open your hearts to the Lord, as we pray:

Covenant Prayer

**O righteous God, for the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,  
see me as I come before you.  
Forgive my unfaithfulness in not having done your will,  
for you have promised mercy to me  
if I turn to you with my whole heart.**

God requires that you shall put away all your idols.  
**I here from the bottom of my heart renounce them all,  
covenanting with you that no known sin shall be allowed in my life.  
In your power  
I will watch all temptations that will lead me away from you.  
For my own righteousness is riddled with sin,  
unable to stand before you.**

Through Christ, God has offered to be your God again  
if you would allow it to be so.

**Before all heaven and earth,  
I here acknowledge you as my Lord and God.  
I take you, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, for my portion,  
and vow to give up myself, body and soul, as your servant,  
to serve you in holiness and righteousness all the days of my life.**

God has given the Lord Jesus Christ  
to bridge the distance between the Holy and the human,  
to be an offering of grace and mercy.  
**Jesus, I do here accept Christ  
as the new and living Way,  
and sincerely join myself in a covenant with him.**

**O blessed Jesus, I come to you,  
unworthy even to wash the feet of your servants.  
I do here, with all my power, accept you as my God and Head.  
I renounce my own worthiness,  
and vow that you are my righteousness.  
I renounce my own wisdom, and take you for my guide.  
I renounce my own will, and take your will as my law.**

**I do here covenant with you, O Christ,  
to take my lot with you as it may fall.  
Through your grace I promise  
that neither life nor death shall part me from you.**

God has given holy laws as the rule of your life.  
**I therefore take them as the rule for my words, thoughts, and actions,  
promising that I will strive  
to order my whole life according to your direction,  
and not allow myself to neglect anything I know to be my duty.**

The almighty God searches and knows your heart.  
**O God, you know that I make this covenant with you today  
without guile or reservation.  
If any falsehood should be in it, guide me and help me to set it aright.  
O mighty God, the Lord Omnipotent, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit,  
you have now become my Covenant Friend.  
And I, through your infinite grace, have become your covenant servant.  
So be it.  
And let the covenant I have made on earth be ratified in heaven.  
Amen.**

we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving  
as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us,  
as we proclaim the mystery of faith.
