Lord God, too often we get it into our heads
that what we do and who we are is all about
our achievement, our wisdom, our status, our position.

And teach us, by your Spirit, always to see each person we encounter and all those with whom we are in relationship with the eyes of Christ the Lord.

Grant this, we pray, so that we might set ourselves to the business and joy of reconciliation in the name of Jesus the Christ. Amen.

Hear now what YHWH says:
