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
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Pastor's Letter

Beloved Siblings in Christ,

Some of the most beloved, cherished memories of my life happened while I was living in a remote mountain community, secluded and nestled deep in the north cascades of Washington. So it really shouldn't come as a surprise that I love the season of Lent precisely for its wilderness themes. When Easter comes, we are reminded that we are a resurrection people – our faith is defined by the belief in new life given to us by the grace of God. Lent, though, reminds us that we are also a wilderness people, and have been from the very beginning. Though the story of Jesus in the wilderness is often viewed as the grounding text for Lent, wilderness has defined our faith journey since the very beginning – since God sent Adam and Eve out from the garden of Eden and into the wilderness of the world. Time and time again, God has revealed Godself to their people in the wilderness, bringing them to a new understanding of their relationship with the Divine. From the beginning of our story, we have been a people wandering in the wilderness, looking for signs of wonder that will lead us back to our Creator.

I am a deep believer in the necessity of taking intentional time away – set apart from the busyness and stress of daily life and human interactions – in order to reconnect with our innermost selves and the Divine that lives within us, so that we can continue to change and grow closer to God throughout our lives. My time at Holden Village was a turning point in my faith journey, in ways that I am still discovering even now, years later. And while not all of us have the ability to simply run away to the mountains for a year to reconnect with ourselves and God, there are still plenty of ways we can make space in our lives for us to step out of our certitude and into the wilderness of wonder and wondering God calls us to explore.



Pastor's Letter

Incorporating contemplative prayer into our daily life and faith practices is one way to help our brains disconnect from our regular thinking patterns and open up to the mysteries and questions that await us in the silence and the stillness. To practice contemplation may sound daunting at first, but the contemplative life is not only for the religiously devout who spend hours in prayer or meditation or silence. Contemplative prayer is rooted in simplicity – it is slowing down, quieting our minds, quieting our hearts, grounding in our bodies, and paying attention to the divine presence that is found in all things. As the monk, mystic, and author Thomas Merton describes it, contemplation is "...spiritual wonder. It is spontaneous awe at the sacredness of life, of being." The more we pay attention to this wonder, the more connected we find ourselves to the source of this wonder.

This lenten season, I encourage you to take time to regularly step into the wilderness to find renewed connection with the Divine. Perhaps this will look like going for a daily walk in a place you are not familiar with, or sitting quietly for 5 minutes every morning, or spending unplanned time writing in a journal to see where your mind leads you. I hope that your time in the wilderness this season will lead you to a newfound understanding of the Divine in our world and in our hearts, that we might stand boldly with Christ on Easter morning as he rolls away the stone.

Annual Meeting Minutes

Spirit of Grace Annual Meeting, January 15, 2023

Before the meeting packets of the reports were distributed, the ballots, and the insert of Proposed Mission Statements & Guiding Values.

The meeting opened with a responsive reading of a Liturgy and the singing of Hymn "Spirit of God, Descend upon My Heart".

Pastor Miranda then read greetings from ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton and ELCA Oregon Synod Bishop Laurie Caesar.

We were then introduced to the new UMC Bishop Cedrick Bridgeforth via video. He is in charge of the Greater NW Area which includes Alaska, Washington, Oregon, and Idaho. Two thoughts I wrote down from his talk are: "Maintain Hope in Jesus Christ 1st and Foremost" and "Hope is on the other side of division."

Pastor Miranda the introduced Reverend Tim Overton-Harris of the UMC in charge of the Columbia River Region. He noted that some of the UMC churches of the area are experiencing splintering, but noted this is the time to determine who we are, what we believe, and where we go from here.

Pastor Miranda read her 'Pastor's Report. Her conclusive paragraph: "I wholeheartedly believe in the mission and ministry of Spirit of Grace, and I believe that God has called us to be agents of change and bearers of the Good News in this time and this place. As the year begins, I invite you all to spend some time in contemplation and discernment. Why has God called you to this community-Spirit of Grace- in this time and this place? How do you understand your role in this community? What are your hopes and dreams for this little congregation with a big Heart? Where do you see the Spirit moving among us recently? Who is God calling you to become in this new year? Come – let us dream together and see what new thing God is inviting us to explore."

Annual Meeting Minutes

Shelley Oates Board Co-chair then led the meeting to vote for 2 new members to the Board; Cindy Murahashi and Doug Swanson. 2 new members for Staff-Parish Relations Committee; Margaret Godard and Lee Huckins. 2 delegates to the ELCA Oregon Synod Conference in May via Zoom this year; Tom Hart and Alicia Bermes. Thank you all for offering your service. 21 Ballots were returned with unanimous votes for all nominees. This meets our quorum requirement.

The meeting continued with the Board Chair's report submitted by both Shelley Oates and Tom Hart. Staff-Parish Relations Committee Report presented by Jill McBee (Chair) who will be leaving this position this year.

Rick McBee delivered the Building Ministry Team Report, acknowledging the following members who are dedicated to maintenance of our church grounds: Scott Fitch, Donna Werhley, Craig Terry and Alan Yenne. Thank you to all who steward this space. Alicia Bermes then gave an update of the Welcoming Church Team activities. This is our commitment to become a 'Reconciling in Christ' congregation (ELCA) and part of the 'Reconciling Ministries Network' (UMC). The team members are Alicia Bermes (Chair), Linda Boris, Debby Chenoweth, Michelle Sibley, and Sharon Poynter. We will be conducting one on one interviews with members of the congregation as we explore this journey.

Finally, Tom Hart delivered the Financial Report. See the separate hand out. Approval of this report goes through the Board and it is informative for the congregation.

Lastly Shelley then directed us to the Proposed Mission Statement and Guiding Values. All attendees were given a copy to peruse. A question from the floor was are the Guiding Values in a specific order and the answer is no, the presentation was somewhat random. The suggestion was to prioritize them.

Approval of this document was presented to the congregation asking for a verbal 'Yea' vote and it passed unanimously.

Pastor Miranda closed the meeting with a prayer.
