Pastor's Letter

Beloved Siblings in Christ,

It has been such a joy this summer to enter the next phase of our journey towards becoming a Reconciling in Christ/Reconciling Ministries Network congregation by engaging in study and education with you all! It has warmed my heart to see so many of you engage with Emmy Kegler's One Coin Found, and come away from it with new wonderings or questions, or feeling affirmed in part of your own faith journey and experience of religion or scripture. Likewise, at our training on Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity and Expression, I watched as those who chose to participate assumed a posture of openness and humility as we listened to Aubrey Thonvold from ReconcilingWorks teach us about the many and varied identities that fall on the spectrums of both gender and sexuality, and helped us get curious about how to step outside of the binaries that we have been taught to perceive as "normal."

In July and August, we will continue this learning journey with Austen Hartke's book, <u>Transforming: The Bible and the Lives of Transgender Christians</u>. Austen Hartke is a transgender person of faith, with a passion for helping trans people see themselves reflected in the stories of Scripture. Now more than ever, as the rights of transgender people are being targeted across the country with hundreds of anti-trans bills being introduced into state and federal legislature, it is crucial that people of faith understand the importance and sacredness of transgender people – not only for their sake, but for ours as well. Through his book, Hartke teaches Christians of faith not only to tolerate or accept trans and gender expansive people, but to read scripture from their perspective and see how our stories of faith affirm the holiness of people who exist outside of norms and binaries time and time again.

Pastor's Letter

There are many reasons why our commitment to becoming an Open and Affirming Church with an intentional welcome to marginalized communities is so important. Most importantly, the Church has played a central role in the harm that has been done against LGBTQIA+ people - so it is vital that we learn how to atone for that past and take steps towards making our churches the safe, nurturing, and welcoming spaces that God intends for us to be. Hartke articulates the power that affirming churches can have in the lives of LGBTQIA+ individuals, especially youth, noting that "...although religious affiliation in families has been connected to rejection of LGBT children, faith can also be one of the largest contributors to well-being in youth if their religious community supports them." However, this is not the only outcome and objective of this journey. As Christians, we know that we encounter God in this world through one another - and thus, the more divided we are from one another, the more separated we become from God. The more we commit ourselves to not only being "seen" as welcoming, but to learning how to see scripture and faith in a more expansive and wonder-filled way, the more we will see just how much of God's story we have been missing by viewing it through our own narrow lens of experience. As Hartke observes towards the end of his book, "...when transgender Christians are accepted and celebrated in Christian communities, the Good Shepherd's flock is put back together, and we once again become more than the sum of our parts."

Remember to take time this summer to read Transforming, and consider how God is inviting you not only to extend an expansive welcome to others, but also how God is inviting you to extend that same expansive welcome to yourself as you allow your own faith to grow, change, and transform.

Welcoming Church Team

The Welcoming Church Team wants to thank everyone who took the time to participate in our SOGIE Training at the end of June! This was an enlightening, engaging experience for everyone involved - here are some of the take-aways participants shared with each other at the end of the training:

What did you learn in this training that you plan to share with others?

- When someone shares their pronouns or identity with you, thank them for sharing and trusting you!
- The difference between sexual orientation and relationship structuring
- The concept of fluidity in regards to gender identity
- Put people over definitions
- New terms, such as skoliosexual, and neo-pronouns such as xe/xir
- Sex assigned at birth, Gender Identity, Gender Expression, and Sexual Orientation are all separate but related components to consider when understanding one's sexual orientation and gender identity and many of these components are fluid (changing over time) and/or exist on a spectrum.

If you missed the training in June, there are still other opportunities for you to register for a SOGIE Training! ReconcilingWorks offers this training to the public about once per month. The next training is September 7th - learn more and register at their website: www.reconcilingworks.org/trainings/talksogie/

These educational opportunities are meant to serve as a starting point, sparking questions and curiosities that we can dig into together with more focused trainings and presentations this fall. 

August Sermon Series

To enhance and build upon the learning we are doing this summer with the Welcoming Church Team, Pastor Miranda will be offering a special Sermon Series in the month of August, based on Austen Hartke's book, <u>Transforming</u>.

This Sermon Series will be on "The Expansive God," inviting us to expand our understanding of God and of God's hopes for us as a Christian Community. If you know someone who is struggling to reconcile the relationship between God and the LGBTQIA+ community, consider inviting them to this sermon series as a way of helping them see how liberating it can be for our own faith for us to understand God in a more open and expansive way.

Ministry Teams Update

In an effort to create a sustainable ministry model for our congregation, we are restructuring the Ministry Teams proposed by Pastor Miranda last year. We currently have a separate ministry team for each of the ministry areas that we want to prioritize: Building and Grounds, Community Outreach, Hospitality and Special Events, Lifelong Learning, Prayer and Visitation, Welcoming Church, and Worship Planning. While these are all important areas of our shared life of faith, we are also a small congregation with limited energy and resources. Rather than spreading ourselves out in this way in the hopes that new members will come and fill in the gaps, we have decided to concentrate our efforts on creating two robust ministry teams that can work collaboratively to build strong lay leadership and involvement in these areas!

In the fall, we will establish our two primary ministry teams - the Outreach Ministry Team and the In-reach Ministry Team:

The Outreach Ministry Team will focus on reaching out to the surrounding community - this will include finding ways to engage with our surrounding neighbors and community, planning events and educational opportunities that are relevant to our community, helping our congregation grow in our understanding of welcome and hospitality, etc.

The In-Reach Ministry Team will focus on reaching out to members within our congregation - this will include planning educational events for all ages, being aware of prayer and visitation needs, offering times for fellowship with one another, planning events that allow us to engage with one another outside of worship, etc.

We will still have some supplementary teams, such as building and grounds and worship planning, that will continue focusing on their specific tasks. The Welcoming Church Team will continue to function as its own ministry team until our Welcoming Statement is approved, at which time their work will shift to the Outreach Ministry Team.

Need for Lay Leadership

A crucial step in making these ministry teams successful will be lay leadership. In order for the future of our church to be sustainable and lead to growth, the bulk of our ministry needs to be led by lay members of our community, rather than just by the pastor. To that end, we are looking for two people willing to be co-leaders of each of these teams (four leaders altogether). These team leaders would work collaboratively with Pastor Miranda to form these teams and establish their goals and responsibilities.

The Leadership Team of Spirit of Grace would like to encourage you all to take some time in the next couple of months to consider whether you have the time, capacity, and calling to take on this roll and help Spirit of Grace live into our collective mission, vision, and guiding values. If you want to know more about what one of these co-leader positions would entail, reach out to Pastor Miranda to set up a time to chat.



Lifelong Learning

Women's Bible Study Fourth Tuesday of the Month July 23rd & August 27th

On the 4th Tuesday of each month at 2pm, women of Spirit of Grace and our surrounding community are invited to gather at the church building for a time of study and fellowship with one another. This group is led by lay members, using the Bible Study from the ELCA magazine, "Gather," which is currently offering a four-session study of the 10 commandments, written by ELCA pastor and author Christa von Zychlin, to help us see how these commandments are more than they may appear at first glance.



Living [in the] Word Third Sunday of the Month July 16th



On the third Sunday each month, Pastor Miranda leads a Bible Study after worship, during which we dig into a scripture text from the lectionary in the last month that we didn't have time to address during worship. This is a chance to engage with scripture as the Living Word of God. We ask questions of the text that help us better understand the history and context of the story, as well as consider how the text has changed over time and what meaning it has in our lives today.

This Here Flesh: Spirituality, Liberation, and the Stories That Make Us


"From the womb, we must repeat with regularity that to love ourselves is to survive. I believe that is what my father wanted for me and knew I would so desperately need: a tool for survival, the truth of my dignity named like a mercy new each morning."

So writes Cole Arthur Riley in her unforgettable book of stories and reflections on discovering the sacred in her skin. In these deeply transporting pages, Arthur Riley reflects on the stories of her grandmother and father, and how they revealed to her an embodied, dignity-affirming spirituality, not only in what they believed but in the act of living itself. Writing memorably of her own childhood and coming to self, Arthur Riley boldly explores some of the most urgent questions of life and faith: How can spirituality not silence the body, but instead allow it to come alive? How do we honor, lament, and heal from the stories we inherit? How can we find peace in a world overtaken with dislocation, noise, and unrest? In this indelible work of contemplative storytelling, Arthur Riley invites us to descend into our own stories, examine our capacity to rest, wonder, joy, rage, and repair, and find that our humanity is not an enemy to faith but evidence of it.

At once a compelling spiritual meditation, a powerful intergenerational account, and a tender coming-of-age narrative, This Here Flesh speaks potently to anyone who suspects that our stories might have something to say to us.

This September, our Book Study Groups will resume meeting on **Sunday mornings at 8:30am** and **Thursday evenings at 6:30pm** to discuss this enlightening text! This book has 15 chapter, which we will begin to discuss over ten weeks in September-November, and will conclude in 5 weeks in January and February, with a pause in the middle for Advent.

Study groups will resume the week of September 10th - keep an eye out for more information in the coming months!

In August, we will be sending out a Membership Audit letter, with a brief form to fill out and return indicating your membership status and current contact information.


How can I help?
