This is the culmination of over a year of intentional learning and discernment as a congregation, led by our Welcoming Church Team. We are overjoyed to proclaim this welcome loud and proud, and are excited to see how the Spirit will use this commitment to spur us into living out God's love in this time and this place. Pastor's Letter

Beloved Siblings in Christ,

At the end of October, we gathered for an important congregational meeting, during which we made commitments that will set the course for our ministry for the next year – and likely beyond that as well. It is particularly fitting that the date of this meeting was October 29th, the Sunday on which we celebrate our shared history and tradition of the Reformation, and remember our calling to always be reformers of God's church on earth.

Our meeting began with a vote to adopt our new Welcome Statement that we have been preparing for throughout the last year. After months of discussion, education, and dreaming together of the kind of community we long to be and become, our Welcoming Church Team created a statement that articulates the explicit welcome that we as a faith community promise to extend to all of God's beloved children, and especially to those who have been historically marginalized by the Church. I am thrilled to say that the statement was adopted and approved with an overwhelming and enthusiastic "yes!" from our congregation! However, this is not the end of our journey; it is only the beginning. To be a Reconciling church is an ongoing commitment - a promise we have made to one another, to God, and to our surrounding neighbors and community. In the coming year, there will be many new opportunities to participate in and live out this commitment in community with one another. It is my hope and prayer that we will all honor this covenant we have made with God, and continue this sacred work of reconciling relationships with all of God's children



Pastor's Letter

This decision was a huge milestone in our ministry together – but we didn't stop there! Our UMC District Superintendent, Tim Overton-Harris, led us in a presentation of the Greater Northwest Area's new ministry initiative, called "The M.I.L.E.", and led us in discerning commitments we were willing to make for each of the four identified areas. They are as follows:

Ministry that Matters: We commit to becoming more connected with the groups that use the FISH community room, and encouraging members of our community to volunteer/participate with these groups.

Debby Chenoweth has volunteered to be the lay leader for this commitment.

Itinerancy & Location: We commit to identifying a lay member representative to service on the GEM Board, in order to deepen our connection with our partners in ecumenical and interfaith ministry throughout the Columbia Gorge. **No one** has yet volunteered to be the lay leader for this commitment.

Lay Leadership: We commit to each pray about and send to Pastor Miranda the names of 1 or 2 members of our congregation who we think the Spirit may be calling to ministry in some way, shape, or form. Pastor Miranda will then convene with the leadership team to identify one individual who we will all, as a community, commit to praying for in the coming year.

Everyone in the congregation is called to participate in this commitment.

Eliminating Racism: We commit to forming more relationships and connections with our Latinx and Indigenous neighbors, and sharing these stories with one another on a regular basis.

No one has yet volunteered to be the lay leader for this commitment.





Pastor's Letter

A central part of this ministry initiative is that each of these commitments be shepherded by a lay leader from the congregation. If you have not already, I am inviting you to spend some time in discernment as this year draws to a close, considering if you have the capacity to help shepherd and steward one of these commitments – and, if you do not have the capacity, how you **will** commit to contributing to these ministry commitments in the coming year. If you feel the Spirit moving you to help lead or support any of these ministry initiatives, please reach out to Pastor Miranda to set up a time to talk.

Though our congregation is small, none of these commitments are beyond our reach. As Christians, we proclaim that we are called to be the body of Christ in God's creation, and to work together to bring about the Kingdom of Heaven on earth for all people. Each of these ministry commitments will help us live out this mission that we believe God has entrusted to us. However, none of these ministries will be possible if we are not willing to each step up and do our part. If we believe that we are called to be God's church on earth, then our actions need to reflect this belief. If all we are willing to do is wait for someone else to answer God's call, then we will find ourselves, like the unwise bridesmaids (Matthew 25:1-13) left out of the celebration when God's Kingdom does become manifest on earth. God's promised Kingdom will always find a way to break through among us – the question before us, then, is this: are we willing to be a part of it? Are we willing to say an enthusiastic "Yes" to the God who created us all?

I pray that you ponder this question as the year draws to a close. My heart and prayers are with you all as we enter the Advent season and await the coming of the Christ child, born in human flesh among us.

Our Welcome Statement

At Spirit of Grace, we believe that the love of God knows no bounds; that every person is beloved by God, bearing the image of the Divine.

We affirm the inherent goodness of all of God's children, many of whom have so often been prohibited from being their whole, authentic selves in God's church on earth. We welcome persons of any and every race, ethnicity, physical and mental ability, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression.

We lament the harm that the greater Church has committed against marginalized communities, and are working to take intentional steps towards repair and reconciliation with these communities. Our faith moves us to commit ourselves to the work of racial equity and antiracism, as we strive to create a world that more closely resembles God's promised Kingdom. We long to be a community of people from all walks of life, made up of every age, race, ethnicity, culture, class, gender, sexuality, socioeconomic status, marital status, physical and mental ability, education, and faith history. We will not tolerate views that promote hatred or exclusion, nor will we allow conflict over differences to divide us. We believe that we are all growing into the fullness of who God wants us to become, and strive to practice grace with one another as we learn and grow.

We believe that God calls us all to be one in Christ, united in our uniqueness and diversity. Whoever you are, and wherever you are in your journey of faith, you are loved by God and welcome here at Spirit of Grace.

Living Out Our Welcome

If you have not done so already, please take a moment to reach out to the members of our Welcoming Church Team to thank them for the extraordinary work they have done in this congregation over the last year! Without the hard work, faith, and commitment of **Alicia Bermes, Linda Boris, Debby Chenoweth, Sharon Poynter,** and **Michelle Sibley**, this journey would not have been possible. We are enormously grateful for the dedication and leadership of this team!

Now that we have adopted our Welcome Statement, we are officially part of the Open & Affirming network of churches through our denominations. In the ELCA, this program is known as Reconciling in Christ - in the UMC, this program is known as Reconciling Ministries Network. Both organizations have directories of Open & Affirming churches, which we will now be listed in. These organizations will also be available to us as a resource as we continue living into this journey of embodying God's radical welcome of all people in this time and this place.

Speaking of living out this welcome, many of you are probably wonder what is next for us in this journey. On the first Sunday in February, we will have a celebratory worship service to honor this commitment and lift up the diverse voices of God's children, each of whom bear the image of the Divine. That afternoon, we will then gather with thee other Open & Affirming congregations in our area (Riverside and Bethel UCC) for a celebratory potluck we are calling the Agape Feast! We will come together as partners in ministry to support one another and discuss ways that we can collaborate in this work together. More information will be available after Christmas!

Sundays in Advent & Christmas Eve
