## Pastor's Letter

### **Beloved Siblings in Christ,**

As creation and the creatures around us have been slowing down, adopting their habits of hibernation and rest this winter season, it feels as though life at Spirit of Grace has been bustling with busyness these last few months! After a January of snow and ice storms that kept most of us hunkered down in our homes, February has felt like a whirlwind of activity as we readied ourselves to begin the season of Lent and contemplate the ways in which we are invited to return to relationship with the Divine.

We began February with a celebratory party: the Agape Feast! Agape is one of the Greek words for love, used to describe the kind of active, self-giving, relational love we experience from God through Jesus Christ, which we too are called to embody in our lives. Our fellow Open & Affirming congregations joined us for this "Love Feast" as together we dreamed of ways to live out God's radical love and welcome in our local community. However, a love that truly honors God is a love that doesn't only focus on what is easy and positive, but takes an honest look at past hurts and harm in order to fully understand what needs to be mended and repaired so that all people can experience the love, life, and liberation of God. This is why we, together with Riverside and Bethel UCC, have embarked on a Lenten journey following Jesus in dismantling the doctrine of discovery with Sarah Augustine's book "The Land is Not Empty." Our conversations thus far have been enlightening and engaging, and I am eager to see where this Lenten wilderness journey will lead us all.

## Baptismal Preperation

Lent is historically a time in the Christian Church when new believers prepare for baptism, learning the stories and traditions of the church as they eagerly await their baptism and official entrance into the Christian community on Easter morning (usually at the end of the Easter Vigil, a long service that begins on Holy Saturday and ends by rejoicing in the resurrection at the dawn of Easter).

This year, a member of our community has begun preparing for their own baptismal journey, and will be baptized in our community on Easter Sunday! Poe Foster has been worshiping with us for the last few months, and meets on Monday afternoons with Pastor Miranda to study and prepare for his baptism. Open Board Position - no assigned role - term expires 2024

Our Board met on Sunday, February 11th to establish these roles and responsibilities, and to set goals for the coming year of ministry. There will be four primary board meetings throughout the year, as well as a concluding meeting in December to wrap up year-end business:

Sunday, April 28th - 11:15 am - 2 pm Sunday, June 30th - 11:15 am - 2 pm Sunday, August 25th - 11:15 am - 2 pm Sunday, October 27th - 11:15 am - 2 pm Sunday, December 8th - 11:15 am - 1 pm

## 2024 Engagement Goals

The following goals emerged from our board meeting. It is our hope that we as a congregation will meaningfully engage in the four goals listed below - each commitment has four suggestions of ways that we, as a congregation and as individuals, can live into this goal.

- 1) Build connections and relationships with our neighbors and community partners so that we can better offer support, advocate for their needs, and celebrate abundant life with them.
  - Get involved and form connections with groups that meet in the FISH Community Room
  - Participate with volunteers who come to serve in the FISH Garden
  - Show up and participate in community events as a congregation
  - Get to know the lives and stories of those who come to the FISH Food Bank
- 2) Cultivate partnerships with our ecumenical, interfaith, and non-profit neighbors so that we can work together to better steward and share our resources in order to meet the needs of our community.
  - Partner with other local open & affirming congregations as we live into this commitment together
  - Work with local non-profits to discern how new life can emerge from the old outreach house
  - Share in worship, study, and fellowship with local congregations
  - Learn from and connect with ecumenical and interfaith partners through GEM
- 3) Encourage and affirm existing and every-day ministries of our congregation so that all can feel empowered and equipped to grow and serve in ways that are lifegiving and spirit-filled.
  - Make space in worship to regularly affirm the ministries and service that happens regularly and often goes unnoticed
  - Cultivate a culture of encouraging the gifts we see in one another
  - Adjust our expectations of one another in order to honor our capacity and serve in ways that are sustainable
  - Support one another in stepping out of our comfort zones and into our growth zones
- 4) Stand in Solidarity with our neighbors who experience marginalization and discrimination, and speak out against oppression and injustice wherever we encounter it.
  - Listen to the stories of our neighbors who experience marginalization, oppression, and discrimination
  - Participate in calls to action in our local and surrounding community however and whenever we can
  - Understand the history of Christianity's endorsement of White Supremacy and other systems of oppression and discrimination so we can work towards dismantling it and creating a more just and equitable future.

## Agape Feast Celebration

On the first Sunday in February, we had a special worship service celebrating our commitment to being an Open & Affirming congregation, a place where all people are welcome to bring their whole selves and be loved as beautiful members of God's expansive and wondrous creation!

After worship, we gathered with our Open & Affirming partners, the congregations of Riverside and Bethel UCC, in the FISH Community Room for our Agape Feast Celebration. We shared in food and fellowship, listened to reflections on why welcoming congregations are so vital, and brainstormed together about ways that we can work together to live into this shared commitment and better reach out to our surrounding communities.

It was a wonderful day full of joy and celebration. Stay tuned to see what fruits will begin to emerge from these relationships and commitments in the coming year!

# Weekly Reflections



#### February 4th: Isaiah 40:30-31

How does your hope and faith in God give you renewal when you find yourself weary? How do you feel when you remember to put your trust in God?

#### February 11th: Mark 9:2-3

When you imagine Jesus' divine self, what do you picture? What images, feelings, smells, or sounds come to mind? How would you have felt on that mountaintop?

#### February 18th: Genesis 9:13

What are you reminded of when you see a rainbow in the sky? How does this beauty of nature bring you closer to God through the covenant?

#### February 25th: Romans 4:16

It is through faith that we receive the promises of God, not through law or works or actions within our control. How does this faith comfort you and stir you to live for Christ?

#### March 3rd: John 2:16-17

A rare depiction of Jesus' anger and zeal against those who would exploit the poor and desecrate the temple. What does this depiction of Jesus teach us about what it means to be faithful?

#### March 10th: Romans 2:8-10

What good works has God created and prepared you to do? How does the grace of God through our faith in Jesus Christ empower you in this work?

#### March 17th: John 12:24

It is only through death and the ending of things that we are able to find new life and new beginnings. What deaths are you seeing around you? How might they bring new life?

#### March 24th: Isaiah 50:4

What word of God sustains you when you need it most? This could be a bible verse, a hymn, a poem, or even a memory you hold dear and sacred.

#### March 31st: Mark 16:8

This version of the resurrection story ends with fear and hesitation. How can we make space for this reality in our celebration of Jesus' victory over death?
